- WHEREAS: This message of hope and understanding is a reminder that the strength of our character is not derived from our imperfections, but our ability and courage to recognize and address them; and
- WHEREAS: The Minnesota Department of Human Services, Chemical and Mental Health Services Administration; the US Department of Health and Human Services, Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration; and the White House Office of National Drug Control Policy invite all Minnesotans to observe the 27th Annual National Recovery Month and participate in its ceremonies, activities, and celebrations.
