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Improvements in Process

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## Screens instead of a Document

- Navigation bar for plan will be on the left of the screen
- Plan itself is on the right side of the screen
- Arrow to identify where in the plan work was last done
- Nav bar includes major sections and sub sections:
  - Title page
  - Safety Plan and Services (OHPP for Safety)
  - Sibling Separation Services
  - Placement and Permanency
  - Health Plan
  - Education Plan
  - Visitation/Contact Plan
  - Signature Page

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## Medical Needs Mockup

**Medical Needs**

Child's youth's current medical and mental health needs:

- Is in good physical health and requires only routine medical and dental care
- Has physical health needs that require frequent medical appointments
- Has a chronic physical health condition or illness that requires medical care in the home
- Screening identified no need to mental health services
- Has mental health needs that require special intervention and/or professional therapy
- Has no known allergies
- Has allergies

Specifically describe the child's youth's medical and mental health needs including information about the selected areas of health needs, the frequency of medical care or required interventions.

To meet the child's current medical needs, the caregiver(s):

- Ensures that the child gets routine medical and dental care, including immunizations.

**Child/Youth Preference**

Child's youth's reasonable preference for placement, if the court deems the child/youth to be of sufficient age to express preferences:

- Child is not of sufficient age to express preference
- Child is of sufficient age to express preference, but has not identified anyone
- Child has identified a person with whom the child would like to be placed and the agency is in the process of assessing that person
- Child has identified a person with whom the child would like to be placed, but the agency has determined that the person identified is not a safe and/or appropriate placement source
- Child is placed in the home or facility of their preference

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

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### Summary

- This OHPP does remain longer than the old format in order to cover all state and federal requirements, including the more extensive Fostering Connections requirements.
- The process using the nav bar is very similar to older SSIS screens and we predict that it is very easy to use.
- It includes full word processing capabilities.
- Whatever is not checked or filled in does not print.
- Visitation section has been simplified.
- There's improved flow, per social work feedback.
- Print problems will be history.
- Plan is to have this available in Version 12.2.

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
