Admission to treatment foster care is based on recommendation of licensed professional who is qualified to direct treatment and familiar with child's individual needs. Recommendation based on diagnostic evaluation and recognize reasons child is at risk for placement in more restrictive residential settings. Upon admission, treatment team must be established for the child. Members are to be parents, treatment foster parents, county case manager, licensed professional directing treatment, treatment foster care social worker, and other persons identified by team.	2960.3310 subp 2 (b)				
Child's treatment plan must be established within 10 days of admission and include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. treatment goals (measurable and identify desired treatment outcomes) that address child's needs as determined by licensed professional directing treatment</li> <li>b. foster parents document daily observations of treatment plan identifies treatment strategies to be used by foster parents</li> <li>c. treatment plan identifies treatment strategies to be used by foster parents</li> <li>d. specific supports and services foster parents will use with child, including substitute and respite care services</li> <li>e. plan must meet the following <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- treatment foster care social worker leads development and documentation of treatment plan</li> <li>- reviewed and evaluated every 30 days by foster parent and treatment foster care social worker</li> <li>- treatment team reassesses treatment plan every 90 days</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	2960.3310 subp 3

Treatment foster parents must complete 30 hours of primary skill development training prior to accepting a placement. Content must cover: a. grief and loss b. attachment c. behavioral intervention d. child development e. discipline f. dynamics of child abuse g. children's mental health h. substance abuse i. cultural competency j. treatment plan development and documentation k. relationship building with primary family l. role of medication in treatment	2960.3330				
Treatment foster parents must complete 18 hours of annual training.
