ORDER OF TEMPORARY IMMEDIATE SUSPENSION

Dear Christine Nwosuji:

Based on the recommendation of Ramsey County Community Human Services Department, the Department of Human Services (DHS) is immediately suspending your license to provide family adult foster care at 719 Marshall Avenue Apt 1, Saint Paul, Minnesota. This immediate suspension is based on a determination that persons served by your program are at an imminent risk of harm. Details of our findings are provided below. Our next steps and your options are also detailed.

The immediate suspension goes into effect on February 24, 2026, at 12:01 am. After this time, you are prohibited from providing family adult foster care.

REASON FOR TEMPORARY IMMEDIATE SUSPENSION

There is an imminent risk of harm to persons served.

On February 20, 2026, Ramsey County determined there is an imminent risk of harm to vulnerable adults served in your home. It was alleged that there was a serious incident involving law enforcement at your home on February 2, 2026, that impacted your ability to provide adult foster care.

Because your program is currently being investigated by Ramsey County, no additional information can be released in this order.

Based on these findings, DHS cannot ensure the health and safety of the persons served by your program at this time. DHS has determined that the health, safety, and rights of persons in your care are in imminent risk of harm. Therefore, DHS is suspending your license to provide adult foster care.

Legal Authority: Minnesota Statutes, section 245A.07, subdivision 2(a)(1).

YOUR RIGHT TO APPEAL

You have the right to appeal the temporary immediate suspension. Your request must be in writing and clearly state that you are requesting a contested case hearing for this matter. Your request must be made before the

deadlines provided below. If you do not meet this deadline, you lose your right to an administrative appeal. Your response time starts when you receive this letter.

If you are mailing your request, it must be sent by certified mail and postmarked within 5 calendar days from when you receive this order. Please send it to:

Upon DHS' receipt of your timely appeal, your case would be scheduled for a contested case hearing in front of an Administrative Law Judge. Following this hearing, the Commissioner of DHS will issue a final order.

Legal representation at the contested case hearing:

You do not need a lawyer to appeal. However, a lawyer can help you with your appeal. The state or county will not get you a lawyer and will not pay for a lawyer. If you cannot afford a lawyer, you may be able to get free legal advice or help with your appeal. Legal authority in this licensing action

- This action is taken under Minnesota Statutes, section 245A.07, subdivision 2(a), which describes under which conditions DHS may immediately suspend a license.
- Because this report remains under investigation, additional information is considered "confidential data" under Minnesota Statutes, section 13.46, subdivision 3.



- A license holder and any controlling individual shall discontinue operation of a program upon receipt of an order to immediately suspend the license under Minnesota Statutes, section 245A.07, subdivision 2(b).
- License holders have a right to appeal licensing actions and request a contested case hearing, under Minnesota Statutes, chapter 14 and Minnesota Rules, parts 1400.8505 to 1400.8612.
