Description

The recent implementation of 245D licensing standards, the Disability Waiver Rate System, and requirements for Positive Supports and person-centered services represent a major change in delivery and payment of supports for persons with disabilities in Minnesota. This session is an opportunity for 245D licensed providers and lead agency case managers to receive information on how these changes intersect and impact one another specific to meeting people's behavior support needs. It will include the topics of common misconceptions regarding 245D, the Disability Waiver Rate System and Positive Supports.
